Opening Remarks

- 1.1 In his opening remarks, the Chairman welcomed MISPA to the Authority for self-introduction of all members present. and allowed
- 1.2 The Chairman indicated that MACRA was notified present the issues to MACRA. not to send a representative to allow the ISPs deliberate the issues freely and later MISPA held with regard to the issue of levy the previous week but thought it sensible of the members meeting which
- 1.3 MACRA indicated that it appreciates the efforts being made by the ISP Association as it allows MACRA deal with all ISPs issues from a common front. The Chairman then requested MISPA to present their issues to MACRA.

2 MISPA PRESENTATIONS

- 2.1 MISPA expressed grave concern that some ISPs had received letters from MACRA from a backdated date of 1st June, 2012. requesting them to be submitting 5% levy from their net operating revenues starting
- 2.2 MISPA further indicated that the issue of levy goes back to the year 2000 when an in order to allow the sector to grow before implementing the 5% levy on ISPs. understanding was reached with MACRA to exempt ISPs from submitting the 5% levy
- 2.3 MISPA further indicated that it appreciates that MACRA had an understanding on exempting ISPs from the levy but is concerned that although the industry has grown and has virtually no government online services. highest Internet access prices, still does not have any noticeable information society since then, Malawi still has among lowest Internet penetration rates, among the
- 2.4 MISPA further appreciated the fact that the sector is continuing to evolve as there is a department in place, among other developments. review of the Communications Act, formulation of e-legislation, an e-government
- 2.5 MISPA further noted with appreciation that Government has made these and other Internet and broadband penetration and use at affordable prices initiatives and announcements so as to see that the sector grows with increased

- 2.6 MISPA expressed concern that the levy on ISPs, which may be considered as one of the Internet Governance issues, carries the risk that it will add to the many annoyances of Internet users in Malawi.
- 2.7 MISPA requested if MACRA could consider the following:
- Reducing the size of the levy (to possibly 1%)
- Levy commencement should not be retrospective
- Reconsider the commencement of the levy and MACRA should send adequate notification to all ISPs on the agreed date through MISPA.
- 2.8 MISPA further noted that the devaluation has had some negative impact on the ISP business as some customers have resolved to buy less bandwidth and others have resolved to de-register some of their staff members as a mechanism to cut costs.

3 MACRA'S RESPONSE:

- 3.1 MACRA indicated that it appreciates the concern raised and clarified that the levy is a to comply within that respect. license condition which the ISPs had signed on obtaining their license and are obliged
- 3.2 MACRA further clarified that considering the twelve (12) years which has passed by, clarified that the levy is calculated on net operating revenue and not on gross revenue. ISPs should appreciate the fact that MACRA has been considerate. Further, the MACRA
- 3.3 MACRA further informed MISPA that the other Telco's provide Internet/data services also levied; in order to level the playing field, MACRA indicated that the ISPs would no and they too submit a 5% levy to the Authority - this implies their Internet service is longer be exempted in paying the levy to the Authority in this regard.
- 3.4 MACRA also informed MISPA that the Authority is required to level the playing field and has been queried by the other telecom operators through their association (ATOL) on why the ISPs do not submit a 5% levy to the Authority.
- 3.5 MACRA further responded that the possibility of gradually increasing the levy from 1% the approach should be accepted against the license conditions. to 5% requires license review and calls for the Authority to find justifications on why



4 LEVY CALCULATIONS AND INCLUSION TO THE SUBSCRIBERS

- 4.1 MISPA further indicated that ISPs were discussing and considering introduction of a submitted to the Authority by the ISPs should be aware that the cost of service being offered includes the Levy to be line item on the invoice to the customers showing the Levy, so that the subscribers
- 4.2 MACRA queried MISPA that presentation of the levy on the invoice would be putting too much burden on the subscribers as levy is calculated on net operating revenue and not the gross revenue.
- 4.3 MACRA and MISPA later agreed that there is a requirement to find the practicality on subscriber's invoices how best the levy would be reflected on the subscribers, this was compared to the example that although companies pay corporate tax, such tax is not reflected on the
- 4.4 On the table in the levy letters showing how the levy amount to be paid would be calculated, MACRA further clarified that upstream charges are deductible because the telecom operators do not include expenses they incur to fellow operators in levy calculation since the requirement is to calculate based on the actual revenues.

5.0 RESOLUTIONS (CONCLUSION)

5.1 MACRA and MISPA eventually agreed that

- the following factors; concerning the gradual process for the submission of levy taking into consideration MACRA will consider their concern and will later inform MISPA of its decision
- \equiv The 5% levy is a licensing condition and if any changes will be made, consultations will need to be done
- $\widehat{\Xi}$ Once negotiations are finalized, MACRA will inform all ISPs of the commencement date of the levy through MISPA
- $\widehat{\equiv}$ All ISP's will be informed through MISPA on the way forward within the month of January 2013.
